

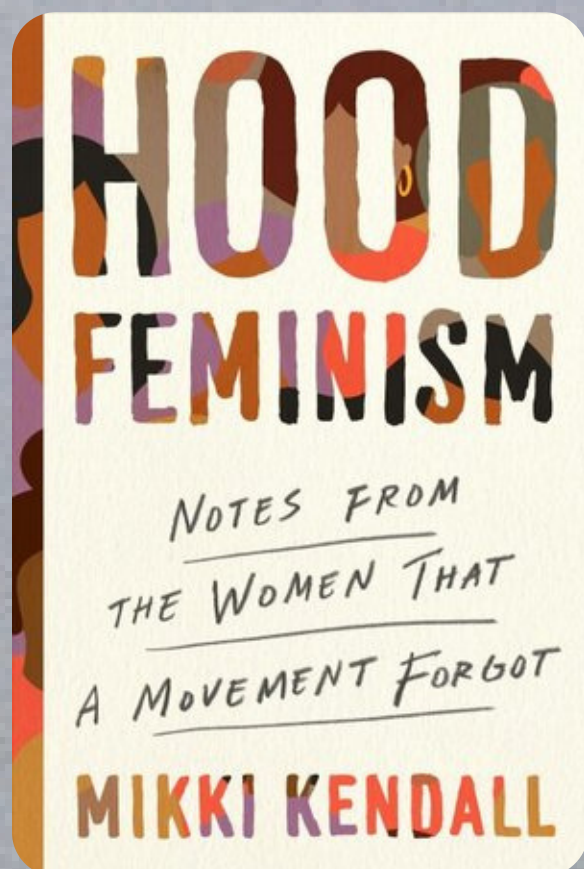

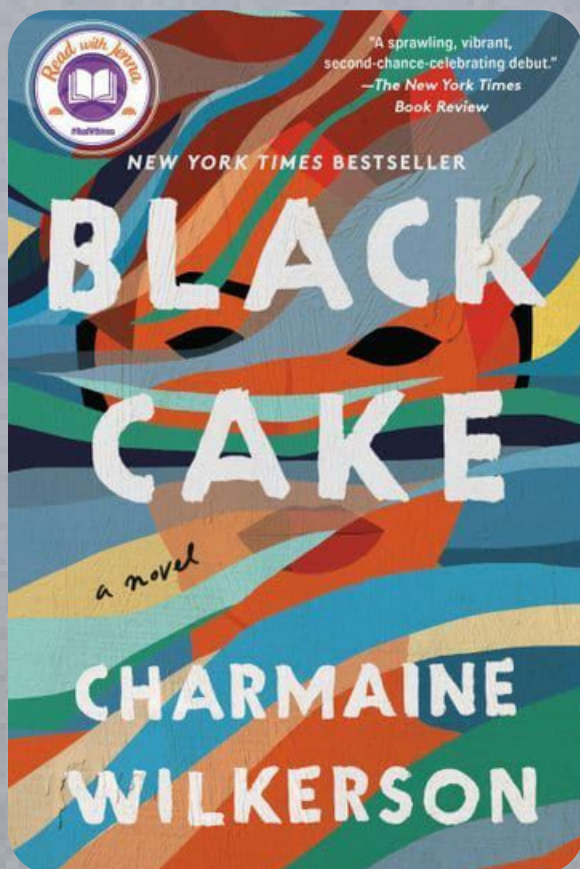




## Such a Fun Age

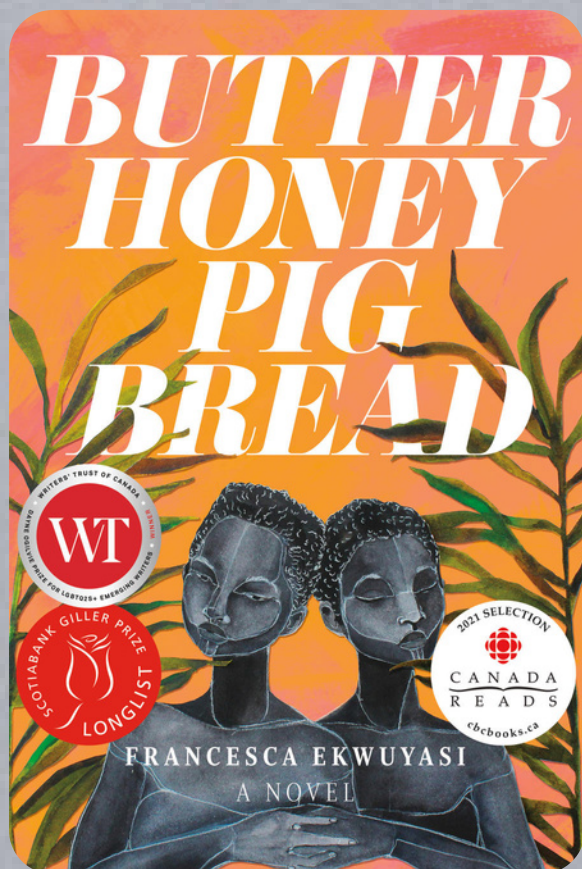


## Black Cake

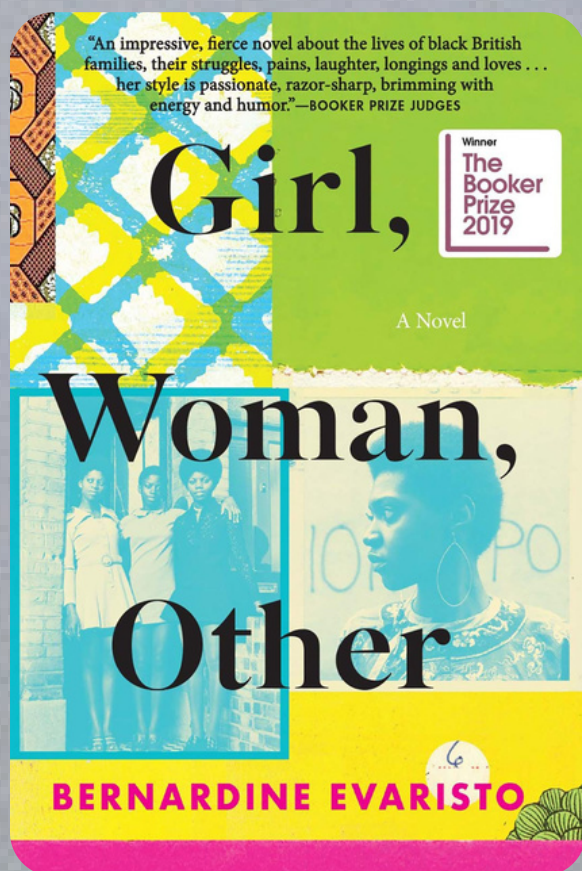




## **Butter Honey Pig Bread**

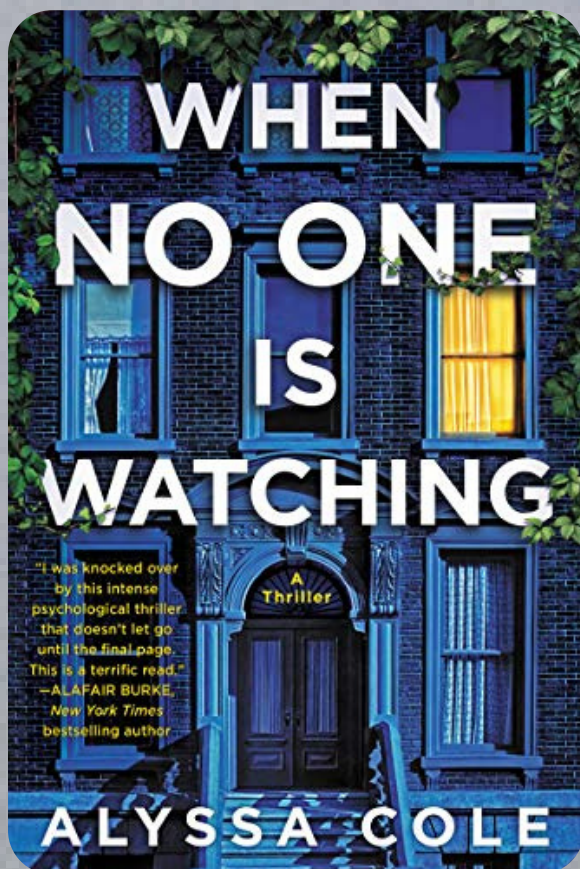




## All Her Little Secrets

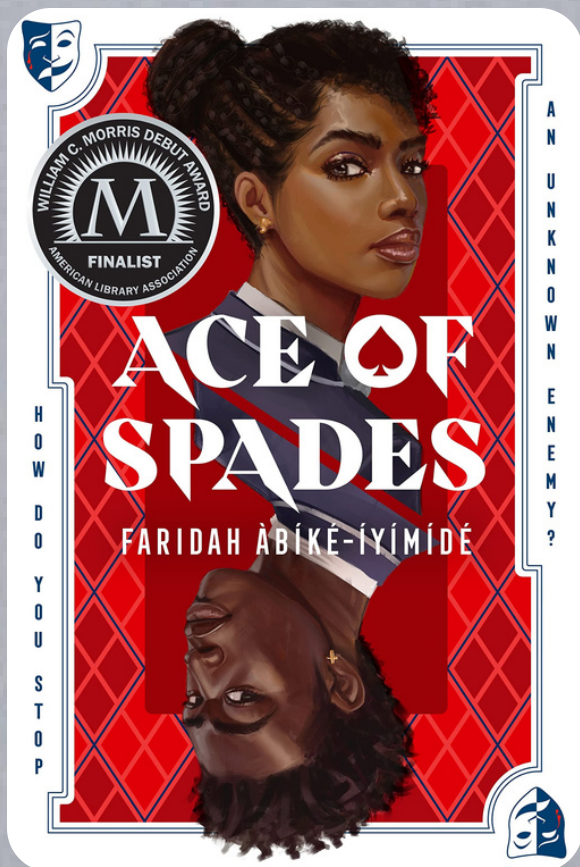


## When No One is Watching
